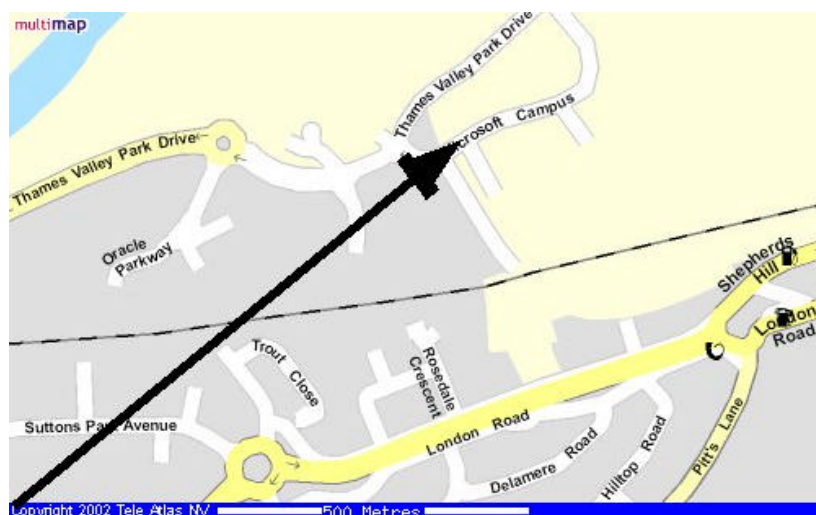

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By Road

The easiest way to approach the Microsoft Campus is to take the M4 and exit at Junction 10, signposted A329(M) towards Reading.

This is a dual carriageway that will become the A3290. Ignore all exits and stay on the dual carriageway. Ignore the exit for Suttons Business Park and the A4, stay on the dual carriageway following the signs for the Thames Valley Business Park.

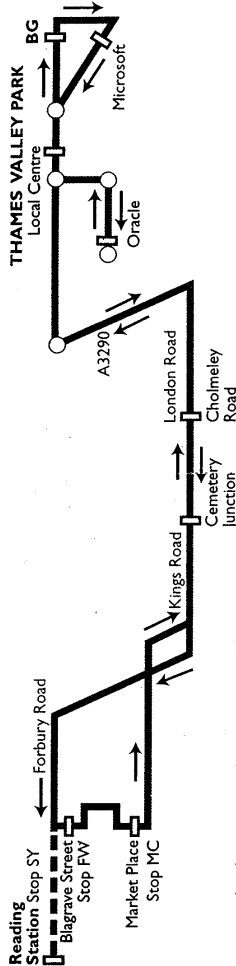
You will approach a roundabout at the end of the dual carriageway. At the roundabout bear right into the Thames Valley Business Park and then stay in the left hand lane. Go straight across the next two roundabouts, then move into the right hand lane and take the second exit off the next roundabout.

You are now in the Microsoft Campus. Follow signs for the Customer Briefing Centre (the third building) and go to the reception in that building rather than the main reception.

By Public Transport

Arrive at Reading Station approximately a half hour prior to your appointment, then take the shuttle bus or a taxi. If using the free shuttle bus from the station, please refer to the timetable for running times but please be aware that they get very crowded. The buses are wheelchair accessible.

Notes:

- 1) Subject to traffic conditions in the Town Centre, buses may take alternative routes to reach the Railway Station.
- 2) Oracle Buildings are served in both directions.
- 3) If time permits, buses will arrive at the BG Buildings, then move onto Microsoft Buildings for customers to alight. Buses will then return to the BG stop for the next departure.
- 4) On journeys to the town centre, passengers can only board at TVP but can alight at London Rd/Cholmeley Rd, Cemetery Junction and the Town Centre.
- 5) On journeys to TVP, passengers can board at the Town Centre, Cemetery Junction and London Rd/Cholmeley Rd, but can only alight at TVP.



Thames Valley Park is one of Europe's leading business parks occupying a site of 173 acres with a mile long River Thames frontage.

Originally the site of the Earley Power Station, this was demolished in the 1970's before being bought by Speyhawk. A master plan was prepared to integrate high quality office accommodation and excellent communication, complemented by a nature reserve and riverside amenities within a parkland setting. The first offices were completed in 1991 and sold to British Gas's exploration and development division.

Oracle Corporation acquired the site in 1994 and began construction with a nursery and leisure club. Part of the site was sold to Microsoft for their headquarter building and part to Argent Real Estates who developed five buildings. Oracle Corporation completed their own headquarter buildings on that part of the site they retained.

Thames Valley Park Management Ltd was formed by the owners in 1998 to manage the open areas, including the Country Park.
